

POULTRY CATCHING CRATE

Many poultrymen are losing money because they do not cull their flock, to remove poor layers, early moulters and other unprofitable birds. Usually the failure to do so is because of lack of catching facilities.

Others lose money because while they cull their birds, they chase their birds to catch them with a hook, and all birds fall off in production as a consequence.

With a catching crate, birds can be caught quietly with a minimum of effort and time. Birds move into the crate quietly and can be handled easily and gently. With layers there is no upset through chasing.

The separation of young pullets from young cockerels; culling of pullets on range; moving of pullets from range to pullet house; catching birds for blood testing and hatchery approval and for culling, are all simplified by use of this catching crate.

Being made with no floor, the crate is easily cleaned. Where the use of a floor in the crate is desirable, a frame of 1" x 4" boards will provide a floor separate from the crate, which is easily moved and cleaned.

No poultryman can afford to be without a catching crate.
